



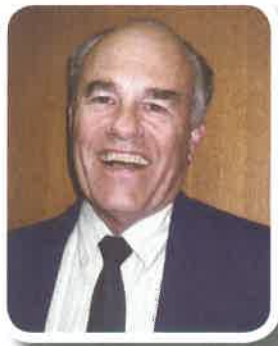

Retirement Board

Dear Friends,

A recent editorial in the Los Angeles Times stated that "Voters in the United States rank healthcare second only to Iraq as an issue of concern in the presidential campaign." For the past several issues I have attempted to keep you informed on healthcare and post retiree pension plans as they may affect us as retired L.A. County employees. Some of you may be getting tired hearing and reading about healthcare and pension reform in the public sector and feel that my Newsletter bylines are getting old and regarded as overkill. I still believe that our County Plan Sponsored/LACERA Administered Medical and Pension Plans should be our number one concern.

Universal Healthcare

Politicians seeking public office are using healthcare in their campaign strategies. They realize that 45 million people in this country lack health care coverage. California has 6.5 million people without medical coverage. Add the fact that a large percentage of the population that lack coverage are children makes the figures worse. We all agree that it would be wonderful for all Americans to have healthcare insurance. Everybody in this Country should be entitled to quality health. A big question is, "Do we really want socialized medicine?" As retired County employees with good medical plans that we worked hard to earn, would a government run universal plan provide us the quality health care that we are accustomed to? Would we be happy to have the government employees who run the Walter Reed Army Medical Center to be in charge of our healthcare system? How about turning over the administration of our universal health plan to the Department of Motor Vehicles? Like it or not, these are legitimate questions.

Socialized Systems Not the Answer

Some politicians and healthcare administrators are expressing support for the socialized systems such as Canada, the United Kingdom and other European nations. I for one am not buying into the idea that more government control will improve our system. Many states such as California are debating universal healthcare. According to the L.A. Times, if you are going to support universal healthcare, then "the state-based approach offers room for regional flexibility and allows for innovation, hallmarks of federalism at its finest. But the federal government should not create this mandate without offering guidance and financial support."

Sorry if I got sidetracked. My intent is not to discourage your support of universal healthcare, but to stimulate your thinking and let you form your own opinions. One thing for sure, it's a controversial subject that will require careful planning if we intend to offer healthcare insurance for all Americans.

Getting Back to L.A. County

The good news is that unlike several other counties in California there are not any changes scheduled to our medical plans in the immediate future (through June of 2008). Also, we have no reason to believe that any major changes will take place during the fiscal year which begins July 1, 2008. We will continue to keep you posted.

Fujioka Named County Chief Executive Officer

On July 10, 2007 the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors appointed William T. Fujioka to be the County's Chief Executive Officer effective July 30.

RELAC welcomes Bill back to County government. He worked for the County from 1978 to 1997 in increasingly responsible positions in the Department of Personnel, the Chief Administrative Office, the Department of Human Resources and in a variety of positions in the Department of Health Services.

A high point of Bill's County service was when, as Administrator of the County's High Desert Hospital, he corrected the hospital's many deficiencies and rescued it from possible closure. The Board of Supervisors commended Bill for Outstanding

Leadership in addressing the hospital's management deficiencies. Earlier the Board commended Bill for achieving Accreditation with Commendation for the Long Beach Community Health Center.

In 1997 Fujioka was lured away by the City of Los Angeles, becoming the General Manager of the City's Personnel Department. In 1999 he was promoted to the highly responsible position of City Administrative Officer. He served in that position with great distinction until his retirement early this year.

Investments Board

At our last General Membership Meeting in June several of you asked if I would publish the top ten domestic and international equity securities held in LACERA's portfolio. In light of LACERA's fiscal year end (June 30, 2007) I decided that now would be a perfect time to provide you with such a list.

Please note that the information I have provided in this article is **unaudited**. LACERA's independent auditor, Brown Armstrong, is scheduled to complete their audit and will issue their audited annual financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007 in early October. LACERA is mandated by State Law to file audited financial statements with the Los Angeles County Treasurer and the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller prior to October 31, 2007. I will provide you with a final report on LACERA's financial condition in a later article once the audited financial statements are available.

Legislation Report

On recommendation of the Legislation Committee the RELAC Board adopted the following positions:

Re-affirmed as a top priority increasing the increase in survivor benefits from 60% to 65% for County employees who retired prior to 2002. This benefit was granted to then active employees in 2002 and in fairness should be extended to all retirees. RELAC will do its utmost to achieve this objective.

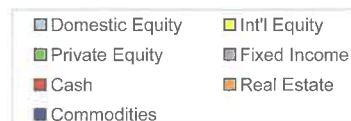
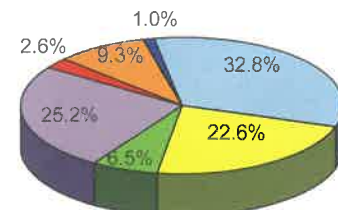
Another vital commitment is to support the elimination by the US Congress of the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision. These provisions unfairly reduce the payments to retired public employees who are entitled to Social Security benefits, while permitting similarly situated private sector retirees to receive their full benefits. On page 5 you will find a model letter drafted by newly elected Board member George Hernandez which you may send to your Senators and Representative to support passage of the Social Security Fairness Act. If passed this Act will restore full benefits to public sector retirees.

Write a Letter to Help Correct a Wrong

Several years ago Congress passed a couple of bills that were discriminatory and unfair, the Government Pensions Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision. These bills reduce the Social Security Benefits to retired government workers by 20 to 80%, based on the amount of pension received. These bills do not affect private sector retirees. This is discriminatory and unfair. Government employees who paid into Social Security deserve full compensation.

Below is a suggested letter you can send to your Senators and Representative urging their support of the Social Security Fairness Act.

It is hard for me to believe that the Social Security Program of this country discriminates against government employees. It denies them the same benefits that their colleagues in the private sector receive. Government employees are being penalized. The Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) need to be eliminated.

I urge you to support the Social Security Fairness Act, S 206 and HR 82, to eliminate these discrepancies and to urge your fellow members of Congress to do the same. Denying a person full benefits that they are entitled to is wrong and needs to be corrected.

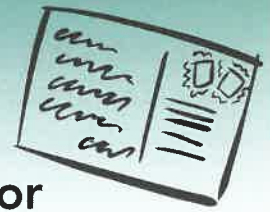

The Board also voted to support two bills pending in the California Legislature. One is AB 36 which would make it a crime to falsely claim benefits from public employee retirement systems. This law is needed to protect the benefits due to those of us who are legitimately entitled to retirement benefits.

The other supported bill is AB 246. It would amend the County Employees Retirement Law, which governs LACERA, to prohibit a member of a Retirement or Investments Board from selling any investment product to any retirement system in the state.. This law will protect our system from conflicts of interest in investing retirement funds.

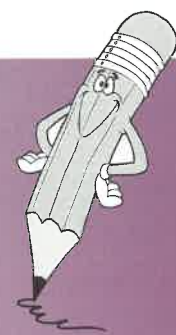

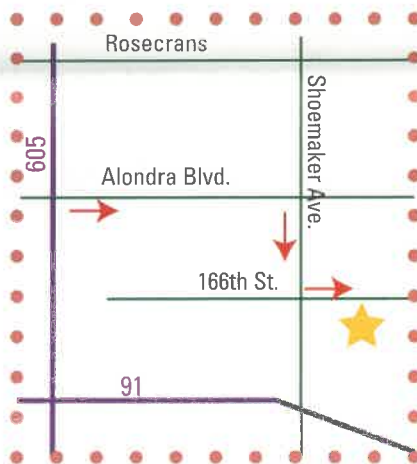
